## Business arising from previous minutes

### 2022 SCHOOL ACTION PLAN DISCUSSION/ QUESTIONS/ FEEDBACK

Deb will talk through the 2022 actions and reflections and next steps along the School Improvement Wall.

O'Connor Cooperative School Mission and beliefs: we keep revisiting our Engoori Indigenous Processes: our Inquiry beliefs and practices: Literacy beliefs and practices: Numeracy beliefs and practices.

These all lead into our school actions and focus for Term 4 and 2023.

### **STAFFING AND ENROLMENTS 2023**

• Current enrolments for 2023 are: Preschool- 16, kindergarten- 18, year 1- 19, year 2- 18. Total: 71. Enrolment increasing slightly.

- As none of our dedicated and awesome staff wish to leave this delightful school community, our teaching team will stay the same for 2023. Aren't we lucky! Class teacher allocation hasn't been decided yet until we look at classes and needs.
- Our school psychologist Fiona McKinnon will be finishing up here at the end of 2022. No updates on 2023 School Psychologist yet.

### STAFF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING and FOCUS TERM 4

- ACT Education Directorate Early Years Community of Professional Practice (COPP).
  - As part of our Inquiry and Inclusion journey, we have had a whole school inquiry focus question around: 'What happens to our community of learners when we inquire together?'. This falls in line with our School Improvement Plan and priorities around Inquiry, Inclusion and Professional Learning Communities. We spoke about the actions and celebrations along this journey so far- more can be read about this on our School Improvement Wall in the foyer.
- ACT Education Directorate 'Finding the Balance in Mathematics and Numeracy Strategies'. Deb and Lorenza leading this through our Spiral of Inquiry with staff as part of our School Action Plan. This will be a focus in 2023.
- Literacy Champions and Coaching in literacy coaching. Deb, Renz and Rose leading and coaching staff in this area around our literacy workshops and the 10 Essential Literacy practices Preschool to year 2.
- Country as Teacher Project 2023- 2024. Connected with UC and ACT ED. Lead by Ben Wilson and David Spillman. (Reading to take home). Linking in with our beliefs and knowledge in early childhood education; inclusion and inquiry. We have been chosen as one of the four ACT schools to be accepted and involved in this project. This will primarily be funded by the Education Directorate and UC.

### **SCHOOL UPGRADES/ WORKS/ CELEBRATIONS**

- The new COLA (covered outdoor learning area), a shaded/wet weather area for outdoor learning activities and assemblies has been completed. We are hoping for the Basketball/ netball court under the COLA to be completed later this term before our year 2s leave. This is all being funded by the Education Directorate.
- Preschool and afters verandas and doors are being upgraded to ensure safety and to create improved and more open indoor/ outdoor learning spaces – works will hopefully be completed during the January holidays depending on materials and builders' availabilities. All funded by the Education Directorate.
- A Community mural along the external wall down the laneway is being designed and painted by an ex-O'Connor Coop student with our current children.
- Our community fete is on track for this weekend. We must thank the P & C for working tirelessly to organise this fabulous community and fund-raising event.
- Year 2 transition visits continue to: Lyneham Primary, Turner Primary, The Ainslie School and Majura Primary.
- Numerous excursions organised for each year level this term to link in with their inquiries of learning. We are very fortunate, and we would like to thank the P & C for primarily funding these.
- Children's week grants and activities. Thanks to Nathan's leadership in this area and on this committee,
  we have been fortunate enough to win/receive four Children's Week grants which allowed our children to
  participate in extra activities: The Reptile man visiting; an excursion to the Southern Cross School Learn to
  Ride facility; Indigenous Art Lessons (date to be confirmed) and Community art mural.
- ACT School Sports Grants thanks to Lorenza. The children and teachers voted on the sports clinics form
  this year: volleyball, soccer and gymnastics in term 4. We have also received grants to buy new sports mats
  and equipment.
- Student free report writing and plannings days: Friday week 3 (teachers will begin moderating and writing reports). Second student free day Monday of week 8 (28<sup>th</sup> November) which we will use for planning into 2023.
- World Teachers' Day tomorrow Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October. Lorenza has organised a treat for the teachers. We spoke about possible School Board and/or P & C involvement next year?

### **End of Year Celebration**

Children's voice is an integral part of our planning at the Cooperative school. With this in mind, the school ministers had a meeting to discuss the process of choosing the end of year celebration. The ministers went back to their class and in a class meeting, they gathered the ideas that the children had for a celebration, voted and shared these at the next ministers meeting. A discussion ensued, followed by voting which resulted in the four most popular ideas being taken back to children and teachers for voting. These ideas included: Talent show and picnic, school play and picnic, games/fun day and picnic, community singing and picnic.

The voting sheets were distributed, and children and teachers selected one only from the list. The votes were collected and tallied. The result was announced at the school assembly last Friday.

The winning idea was a School Games and Fun day and afternoon community picnic. Half of the school's children voted for this end of year event.
